Growth Spurt

"...to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ." *Ephesians 4:12-13*

A couple of weeks ago, my parents (who live with us) mentioned that they noticed that Aria had grown several inches since the beginning of winter, when she turned 2 years old. As John and I struggled to remember her height from her last doctor's visit, we noticed that her clothes, which were always a little too loose on her seemed to be fitting better lately. I also noticed that she had been asking for more rice at meal times and looking for snacks throughout the day as though her meal times were too far apart. She also found a new liking for meat...I guess she hit a growth spurt! Aria is thriving as a two-and-a-half-year-old. Praise God!

I learned long ago in biology class that the evidence of life is growth! This is affirmed by a science article I came across recently that said there are 7 characteristics of living things:

- 1. Movement, all living things move in some way.
- 2. Respiration, releasing of energy from food.
- 3. Sensitivity, ability to detect changes in the surrounding environment.
- 4. Growth, all living things grow.
- 5. Reproduction, the ability to reproduce and pass genes to offspring.
- 6. Excretion, getting rid of waste.
- 7. Nutrition, intake and use of nutrients.

These make a lot of sense!

This reminds me of Apostle Paul's letter to the Ephesians where he encourages his church to "mature," that as the body of Christ, one must strive to grow, mature, and be built up in love. As disciples of Jesus Christ, we are instructed to be a living and thriving body of Christ by being active in practicing loving and serving others, to grow spiritually by participating in feeding on the spiritual food or practicing the spiritual disciplines like praying, fasting, and studying, reading, and meditating on the scripture, etc. and ridding ourselves of what is unhealthy.

These are what we as a church are focusing on as we continue to live into God's vision for us at UMCG: to **Reach Up** in worship and spiritual formation, **Reach In** in loving and welcoming one another, and **Reach Out** in service to others. And a great time to start is during the season of Lent as we mimic Jesus in his time in the wilderness. As he engaged in the spiritual disciplines, he grew closer to God, gained focus in his mission, and was energized for the ministry to which God had called him.

What are the signs that you are growing spiritually? What <u>spiritual disciplines</u> will you engage in with your brothers and sisters at UMCG - weekly worship with the Lenten sermon series "Giving It Up," Bible study with *Disciple Fast Track*, or the Lenten book study *Simplifying the Soul?* Consider joining us in this time of growth in our church! How much will we have matured by Easter?

Worship in March begins with Transfiguration Sunday, immediately followed by Ash Wednesday, ushering in the season of Lent. *Giving It Up: A Sermon Series for Lent** begins Sunday March 10. Many of us give up certain things for the forty days of Lent, and doing so can be very beneficial. This seven-week series takes that idea one step further. Each week addresses something that God wants us to give up, not just for forty days, but throughout our lives.

March 3 Transfiguration Sunday/First Sunday/Holy Communion Luke 9:28-36

Transfiguration is an experience for both Jesus and us. We, too, need to be transfigured by his life and teachings. This begins by listening to him and his call to a transforming, active love for God and others. Chancel Choir will perform Scott Stevenson's **anthem** "Christ Upon the Mountain Peaks" at 9 a.m. service. Pastor Rich preaches.

March 6 Ash Wednesday Service 7:30 p.m. Joel 2:1-2, 12-17; Psalm 51:1-17 Imposition of ashes. A heart that is centered on God flows through today's scriptures. The prophet Joel exhorts us to "return to God with all our hearts" while the Psalmist prays "God, create in me a clean heart." As we begin the Lenten season, we are reminded of our mortality and invited to change our hearts, returning again to the God who loves us. **Pastor Esther preaches.**

March 10 Giving Up Control Genesis 2:15-17; 3:1-7; Matthew 4:1-11 (Time changes today) Adam and Eve disobeyed God, thinking they knew better than God, with disastrous consequences. Tempted in the wilderness, Jesus gave up his own impulses and followed God's will. In a world where we are used to having control over so many things, God wants us to give up control and give him the final say in our lives. **Pastor Rich preaches.**

March 16 Saturday Evening Worship 5:00 p.m. Deb Vensel will share about her mission last year in West Virginia addressing food deserts there. Followed by fellowship and refreshments.

March 17 Giving Up Expectations Genesis 12:1-4; John 3:1-17

Abraham followed God's call to leave his homeland and travel to the place God promised his descendants, even though he didn't know how it would all work out. When Nicodemus talked to Jesus, he had a hard time understanding what God's grace was really about. What expectations do we have about life? Yet whatever circumstances we may face, we can trust that God will be with us. **Pastor Rich preaches.**

March 24 Giving Up Superiority John 4:5-42

Jesus broke all kinds of conventions by speaking to a woman in public, a Samaritan no less, whose life was such a mess it could have marred Jesus's reputation as a holy man. But Jesus brought his message of grace and freedom to her, knowing that she would hear, respond and witness to his love. Letting go of our status symbols and judgmental attitudes helps us hear and respond faithfully to Jesus's call in our lives. **Pastor Esther preaches.**

March 31 Giving Up Enemies Luke 19:37-44.

Loving our enemies seems impossible. Yet Jesus calls us to do just that, following his example. We call Jesus the Prince of Peace. Our challenge is to believe the Lord and live like peace is possible in our highly polarized world today.

Join in Reading the Gospels in Lent 2019

Once again UMCG is encouraging everyone to read the Gospels during Lent. The following reading plan is offered as a guide to enriching your Lenten experience. Before you begin reading each day, prepare by clearing your mind of the distraction in your life so that you can focus totally on the Bible passage. Read silently or aloud with both mind and heart open to the message. When you finish, reflect on what you have



read, on how it relates to other passages in the Bible, and on how it relates to your life. **Share** what you have read and your reactions with family, a "reading buddy," or a reading or study group with whom you enjoy fellowship face-to-face, by telephone, or by e-mail, Facebook, or other social media. Most importantly, **pray** to God in thanksgiving and supplication, and **listen** in silence for God's voice.

Did you know that **Lent**, a period of penitence marked by prayer, meditation, and fasting in preparation for Easter, is one of the oldest observances in Christianity?

Early Christians believed that special preparation was necessary for the observance of Easter and by the second century Lent was an established practice. The institutional church formalized it as a period of 40 days in recognition of Christ's fasting in the wilderness early in his ministry (Matthew 4:1-2). Because Christ's arrest, trial, and martyrdom occurred during Passover, Lent and Easter observances occur at the same time of the

The word *Lent* comes from the Anglo-Saxon word *lencten*, meaning spring, and the word *Easter* is derived from the name of the Norse goddess *Eostare*, associated with spring. Early missionaries incorporated these traditions in their practices.

Lent is a season of 40 days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Sundays are little Easters, tempering the penitential spirit of Lent with joyful expectation of the Resurrection. Somber colors such as purple or ash gray are used in the sanctuary during Lent, and are usually removed on Good Friday.

Even Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, has pre-Christian roots. Sackcloth and ashes were associated with sacrifice, grief, and repentance in the pre-Christian era. Today, the ashes on a person's forehead are a reminder of human frailty, mortality, and redemption by grace through the death of Christ.
