Pastor's Page

Graced!

Every year I look forward to the first two weeks in May. Why? Well, as an avid bird watcher, this narrow window of time offers a rare opportunity to be in the presence of some very special songbirds migrating through our area. Each year I prepare by making sure our fly-through bird feeder is stocked with premium bird seed, the suet is hung, the peanut feeder is full, sliced oranges are affixed to the roof of the bird feeder, and nectar fills the humming bird feeding tube. Then we wait and watch. This year has been a bonanza of redbreasted grosbeaks, Baltimore orioles, rubythroated hummingbirds and even an indigo bunting dining on the food provided. God has graced us, literally, through this annual festival of migrating birds.

Jesus spoke of birds and flowers in Luke 12:22-31 as he addressed his disciples' anxiety over having their basic needs met for food, clothing and shelter as they wandered both Galilee and Judea following their master and teacher. A close observer of Luke remarks, "Why should they be anxious about their basic needs when God feeds birds and clothes the flowers of the field? Are not persons more precious to God than these? On the other hand, humans need to acknowledge their limitation, and not try to control what they cannot, such as the length of life or their stature. Anxiety, it would seem, is a product of not acknowledging and balancing both the specialness and limitedness of human existence."¹ Jesus's words of wisdom are well worth pondering—and living into—as we continue to face the threat of Covid-19. Ultimately, our lives are in God's good and safe hands.

June 7 Trinity Sunday – <u>Genesis 1:26-28; Matthew 28:16-20</u>

Today's scriptures remind us that our God is a relational God. God speaks in the first person plural in the first creation story (Genesis 1:26). In Matthew's Great Commission, Jesus sends his disciples in global mission, exhorting them to baptize in the name of the Triune God. Created in God's image, we are God's partners in caring for creation and sharing the Good News of salvation. Pastor Rich preaches.

June 14 2nd Sunday after Pentecost/Pastor Esther's Farewell Message

One of the first sermons Pastor Esther preached at UMCG was on Matthew 14:22-33, the story of Peter walking on water in the midst of the storm. As we celebrate her last Sunday with us today, we go back to this scripture passage with the sermon titled, "Stepping Out." What message does God have for us today as we remember the good times we had together, look forward to the coming changes, and renew the assurance of the hope God gives us to face the "storms" before us: the pastoral transitions but also the future transitions, changes, and challenges in our lives. Pastor Esther preaches.

June 21 3rd Sunday after Pentecost/Father's Day – <u>Matthew 9:35 – 10:1,3-8</u>

On this Father's Day, Pastor Rich will preach from this text in Matthew's Gospel, a text that was his missionary father's favorite preaching passage on missions. What can fathers (and all of us) learn about God's mission—and ours—in the world? Pastor Rich preaches.

June 28 4th Sunday after Pentecost – Matthew 10:40-42

Here, at the end of Matthew's mission discourse, Jesus sends his disciples off with warnings and some encouragement, as they wonder how they will be received. Hospitality was essential to the early church's traveling preachers. It is more than just a one-time effort; it is a way of life. What does welcoming and being welcomed look like in the time of physical distancing? Pastor Becky preaches.

Reading and Praying the Psalms for Summer An Offering from the Adult Council

This summer, add to your personal devotions the active reading and praying of the Psalms, the book of the Bible, which perhaps expresses more than any other the full range of human emotions from anger to love and grief to sorrow. After reading each psalm, compose a prayer that captures the essence of the psalm as it speaks to you and use the prayer as a guide to your way forward in faith. Keep a log of your prayers and review it periodically to understand more fully the character of your prayer life.

Before you begin reading each day, **prepare** by clearing your mind of the distraction in your life so that you can focus totally on the Bible passage. **Read** silently or aloud with both mind and heart open to the message. When you finish, **reflect** on what you have read, on how it relates to other passages in the Bible, and on how it relates to your life. **Share** what you have read and your reactions with family, a "reading buddy," or a reading or study group with whom you enjoy fellowship face-to-face, by telephone, or by e-mail, Facebook or other social media. Most importantly, **pray** to God in thanksgiving and supplication, and **listen** in silence for His voice.
