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Reading and Praying the Psalms for Summer An Offering from the Adult Council

This summer, add to your personal devotions the active reading and praying of the Psalms, the book of the Bible, which perhaps expresses more than any other the full range of human emotions from anger to love and grief to sorrow. After reading each psalm, compose a prayer that captures the essence of the psalm as it speaks to you and use the prayer as a guide to your way forward in faith. Keep a log of your prayers and review it periodically to understand more fully the character of your prayer life.

Before you begin reading each day, **prepare** by clearing your mind of the distraction in your life so that you can focus totally on the Bible passage. **Read** silently or aloud with both mind and heart open to the message. When you finish, **reflect** on what you have read, on how it relates to other passages in the Bible, and on how it relates to your life. **Share** what you have read and your reactions with family, a "reading buddy," or a reading or study group with whom you enjoy fellowship face-to-face, by telephone, or by e-mail, Facebook or other social media. Most importantly, **pray** to God in thanksgiving and supplication, and **listen** in silence for His voice.

UMC of Geneva working to make masks available in Kane County and the DR By Sharon Anderson Schmal

During these uncertain times of the Covid-19 pandemic, members of the UMCG faith community have been contributing financially and volunteering with MASK-UP KANE COUNTY (MUKC), making more than 60,000 masks for non-profits throughout Kane County, including Hesed House, Mutual Ground, and Lazarus House. UMCG has been working with Kids Alive for 10 years, and in April learned they were also desperately in need of supplies. Christine Schirtzinger, founder and coordinator of MUKC, graciously allowed UMCG to purchase mask supplies to go to the DR even though the focus of the organization is local. In just three days, UMCG folks made and shipped more than 600 masks to our Dominican friends.
