Connecting with your UMCG Neighbors

Who are the UMCG people in your neighborhood? By now you should have received an email with a listing of the UMCG folks who live near you – within 1-2 miles for the most part. Some “neighborhoods” cover more miles. It is Pastor Lisa’s and Pastor Rich’s hope that we can cultivate new and good relationships with our church folks nearby, to foster extra support systems during this pandemic that allow us to share prayer joys and concerns, to play some games together, to do some service projects together, and to become an “extended family” of several generations for many of us for whom family is far away and difficult to see in person.

Pastor Rich and Pastor Lisa will be contacting people to take some leadership roles for each group: one person to email or call for prayer joys and concerns to share with the neighborhood and church each month; and one person to serve as convener and information channel for once a month meetings in person (weather permitting) or online (zoom). The convener invites folks to share some ice breaker conversations and/or socially distant games or zoom games (uno on zoom?! Can it be done?!) (apples to apples on zoom? I think we can!) once each month. Neighbors should bring their own food or drinks and wear masks if meeting in person.

Different neighbors can organize the games, or host the meeting in their yard, a local park, or in their driveway even. And, the convener or one of the neighbors can take a vote and organize a service project for those in need in

the neighborhood or community, or to organize financial donations to favorite local or church charities.

The neighborhood groups could also do a book study together; Pastor Lisa and Pastor Rich will be leading one starting this fall, and again in the new year, for any to participate in.

Really, it is rather like a youth group in your neighborhood! Once leaders volunteer or agree to serve for a while, Pastor Lisa will email a list of ice breaker questions (get to know you questions that are fun to share about), a list of service organizations and projects, some guidelines for group sharing, and a list of books and/or book studies to participate in. These lists have been put together by our Reach In, Reach Out and Reach Up teams. The convener can share these with their neighbors, and different folks can volunteer to host, lead, or organize the group’s monthly gatherings.

Some neighborhoods will have more children, some will have more seniors, but there are opportunities to share and care across all age levels. Some may want more active gatherings, some may just need cards and phone calls. The group will become what you want it to be, as you invest your heart and time into it. It can be a great way to alleviate loneliness and to share and care for one another: shopping for seniors, tutoring children, raking leaves together, sharing recipes for Thanksgiving, Christmas caroling in the neighborhood... you name it, plan it safely, and it can be a blessing for many!

Using the image of a runner, the Apostle Paul encourages the believers in Philippi to imitate him as he presses on toward the goal: “the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus.” This highest goal focuses the whole of life for both the individual and the faith community. Paul offers practical advice on how best to run, and win the ultimate race in life. **Pastor Rich preaches.**

All-Church Fall Book Study - *Questions God Asks Us* by Rev. Trevor Hudson

Pastor Lisa and Pastor Rich will lead Zoom studies using the book ***Questions God Asks Us*** this fall: Pastor Lisa on Sunday mornings at 10:30 a.m., beginning October 18; Pastor Rich at another time to be determined. Using the questions God and Jesus ask us in the Bible, readers are invited to grow our faith and our relationships with one another. - Maintains prayer concerns list and mails sermons and prayer concerns
- Prepares bank deposit from mail-in donations and schedules liturgists for worship services
- Updates Elexio database and assists Debbie and Becky with other administrative tasks

Scott Stevenson

- Producing music and video content for weekly online worship
- Creating Tuesday and Thursday music segments
- Planning online and in-person worship along with the rest of our worship leaders

Mike Popplewell

- Makes weekly recordings for online church service
- Reaches out to choir members/communicating with music
- Participates in planning weekly on Zoom meetings for upcoming online services, Church in Society, ASP

Denise Clementz, Youth Director

- Met with youth and volunteers regularly on Zoom/Discord for Sunday school/Youth Activities all summer
- Worked as part of Renovation Team with Keith Rawson to assess/build Children's and Youth ministry
- Meets regularly with Ministry Architects to define goals and boundaries and hone skills

Becky Nicol

- Works with Worship Planning Team/Tom Nicol to produce weekly worship videos, and with Health Team
- Makes online forms, web banners and FB posts, and schedules and attends lots of Zoom meetings

- Coordinates pastoral visitation of homebound and hospitalized members
- Provides Staff support for Stephen Ministers, Friendly Visitors, Tuesday Prayer meeting, Spirits & Studies

**Children's and Youth Ministries
Renovation Process Progress Report
September 15, 2020**



In September 2019, Ministry Architects conducted an assessment of the children's and youth ministries at UMC of Geneva and delivered an assessment report that included recommendations and an 18-month timeline. The Renovation process prescribed in the report began in earnest but has been halted a few times due to unforeseen circumstances such as the passing of a staff member and the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic in the United States. The Renovation Process resumed in June 2020 and what follows is an overview of what has been accomplished thus far in the renovation process:

- The Renovation Team has met monthly since June, with team members also receiving specific tasks between meetings.
- Regular coaching calls with a Ministry Architects consultant have been provided to Director of Youth Ministries, Denise Clementz.
- Regular coaching calls with a Ministry Architects consultant have been provided to the Chairperson of the Children's Ministry Council, Ali Wetmore.
- A [Fall 2020 Children's Ministry Game Plan](#) has been created, including plans for an in-person kick-off meeting, bi-weekly virtual gatherings, hand-delivered monthly packages of interactive activities for families, and extra faith formation content for families to utilize between Zoom gatherings.
- Revised job descriptions for both the [Children's Ministry Council](#) and the [Youth Ministry Council](#) have been created and reviewed.
- Job descriptions for [all nursery workers](#) and for [children's Sunday school teachers](#) have been drafted.
- A [volunteer application](#) and a [volunteer application and screening process](#) have been drafted for use in both ministries.
- A [volunteer megaboard](#) has been created for tracking volunteer needs and volunteer recruiting. A list of over 50 potential volunteers and their contact information has been created in the megaboard.
- A survey was sent out to families of children to find out their ministry needs and preferences for the fall of 2020 in light of the COVID-19 conditions, and 11 families replied to the survey with valuable insights that have helped the Children's Council craft a ministry strategy for the fall.
- A fall 2020 youth ministry strategy has been developed, including both fun-based and formation-focused virtual gatherings as well as occasional in-person gatherings.

Ministry Architects is honored by the privilege to work with the staff and volunteers of UMC of Geneva. We are inspired by the resilience of this church's leaders in the face of such intense adversity. We look forward to what God will accomplish in the children's and youth ministries in the coming months as well.

Neighborhood Groups to Begin this month!

Pastor Lisa and Pastor Rich encourage you to convene a meeting either in person (outdoors, with masks and socially distant) or on zoom this month. Please invite Pastor Lisa to join you – she’s hoping these group meetings will allow her to get acquainted with more folks in our church! You can email Lisa at (lisa@genevaumc.org) or phone her (630/605-4423) to extend the invitation. She will try to make as many as she can, first come, first served. If she doesn’t make your October meeting, she will give your group priority in November or December!

Our hope is that your neighborhood group will organize monthly meetings for socializing, and possibly for a study group or service project as well, from time to time. We are envisioning them to be similar to a youth group, only for all generations. It can become an extended family of sorts, to share joys, concerns, needs, and opportunities. Your neighborhood leaders will receive lists of ideas for icebreaker questions to encourage sharing and getting to know your UMCG neighbors at these monthly gatherings. They will also receive lists with ideas for service projects, book studies, and guidelines for group sharing. We hope that your group will develop new and deeper relationships to help sustain our church family better through these pandemic times. Many do not have easy, if any, access to their extended family, but we can help each other through the loneliness and needs of these days.

The Pepper Valley group has met once, and set their October meeting to be a bonfire gathering in one neighbor’s backyard. One neighbor is researching service project options for the neighbors to do together. Another was contacting those who missed the first meeting to invite them to the next meeting. Folks will be contacts for prayer joys and concerns before the October meeting. Several expressed interest in the church fall book study and will decide whether to do it as a small group, or with the church.

As groups develop, you may even want to include some other neighbors, not members of our church, in your groups, and you may help some folks to experience Christian fellowship for the first time, in a good way. Please do extend the hand of friendship and support to those in need! A service project for your group may include helping out a family or senior in need in your neighborhood. The groups are not meant to stay exclusive to our UMCG members, but we thought starting with our membership would be a good way to begin.

Some groups include more seniors, who may not be able to participate much online, but would appreciate calls and cards; other groups may include more children and may want to engage in more active gatherings or games (that would be safe). You and your groups will define how you share and care for one another. Our hope is that sharing prayers and gathering once a month can help you to feel more connected to folks who care about you, in these socially distant days.

The **Reach In** and **Reach Out** teams will be available to help resource groups for games, conversation starters and service project connections; Pastors Lisa, Rich, and Mary Gay will be resourcing groups for pastoral care. Pastor Rich will resource northern Geneva, St. Charles and Elgin areas; Pastor Mary Gay will resource our 3 western groups, Elburn, Sugar Grove, and Dekalb/Sycamore; and Pastor Lisa will resource south Geneva, Batavia, and North Aurora.

May God bless and grow our efforts to care for and share with one another, that we may grow spiritually and in outreach to serve even other, new neighbors!

The Ordination Service will be livestreamed on Friday, Nov. 13, at 4 p.m. Only essential business and actions will be taken care of, referring others to the 2021 Annual Conference.

Fires, Coronavirus Complicate Western Disaster Relief

Box 980250, West Sacramento, CA 95798-0250. Make checks payable to "California-Nevada Annual Conference," and write "CN Disaster Response" in the memo line. Contributing to the Conference disaster response fund helps the Conference to respond quickly to immediate needs and to partner with UMCOR for both emergency and long-term recovery.

Beware of Phishing Scam

Once again, several churches and pastors are reporting fake emails being sent asking for gift cards or money. The scammers are creating email addresses that typically include the pastor's name and their church's name and often end with @gmail, @yahoo, or other popular email service providers. Clergy or conference staff (including the Bishop) would never solicit personal payment through text messages, emails, or other forms of digital communication. Do not click on anything in the email and report it to your provider as spam or fraudulent email.

Health Team Update #4

The UMCG Health Team, including pastors, continues to meet weekly to address all the issues and plans as we move forward during the pandemic. The Trustees are also heavily involved. The NIC Return Team held another Zoom meeting August 27, and five UMCG Health Team members participated.

As we plan for eventual indoor worship, the Team, assisted by the Trustees, is working on tasks such as assessing the capacity of various rooms, planning exits, providing sanitizer and extra masks, establishing cleaning protocols, and creating a sign-in/tracking system. Before any indoor worship can take place, there needs to be adequate airflow and hourly air exchanges in the Sanctuary, or other room, if used. The Trustees are working to evaluate the current airflow and report to the Team about what is possible with our equipment.

The Health Team has worked with the pastors and Worship Team to offer Outdoor Worship Services on August 30, September 6, 20, and 27; and are also planning for October.
