Northern Illinois 2020 Annual Conference held via Zoom

The 181st Northern Illinois Annual Conference met via Zoom on Saturday, November 14. Clergy and lay members also attended a Pre-Conference briefing with Bishop Dyck, a technology training with GNTV, three sessions of Bible study with Rev. Junius B. Dotson General Secretary (chief executive officer) of Discipleship Ministries, in October, a finance briefing, as well as the Memorial service on November 13 and the retirement service on the Saturday evening. The ordination service was postponed.

Legislation included historical reports, passing the 2021 NIC budget, created a task force to do Anti-Racism training in the conference, reduced the number of districts from six to five, effective July 1, 2021, and accepting nominations to conference committees.

The Conference was presided over by retiring Bishop Sally Dyck. Starting on January 1, 2021, the NIC will be headed by (retired) Bishop John Hopkins for most of the year. The Conference included a message from Bishop Hopkins. Videos of all of the Annual Conference may be viewed at <u>umcnic.org/AC2020</u>.

Pastor's Page

Advent means "coming" in Latin. The early church created this season before Christmas to help us prepare our hearts for the birth of Christ. As we wait, we remember who Jesus is for our lives and our world, and we read scriptures from Old and New Testament reminding us of the darkness of problems and struggles and suffering and despair in our world, and then we read Scriptures from Old and New Testament reminding us of the Light and Love and Hope and Joy that God brings to us and our world in the baby Jesus. And so, we wait with longing and hope for God's salvation to be born anew in our hearts and our world.

This Advent, this December, we wait during a pandemic, which makes very clear and personal to us the struggles, problems, suffering and despair in our lives, and in our world. As a church, we invite you to join one of our many Zoom studies of Rev. Adam Hamilton's book <u>Incarnation</u>. In our discussions of the book we will reflect on the many names of Jesus that describe his saving presence for our lives and our world. Our worship will be based on these same texts. While we wait in darkness, we remember a great light is coming and has been sent to save us. This light is manifest in our lives even now, in the everlasting love of Jesus that we share with one another. I encourage you to share the light of Christ's love in safe and tangible ways with others this coming month: send a card to friends and those living alone; drop off cookies to neighbors, send gifts through our Angel Tree program, zoom with family and friends! As a family, create two lists of ways to share love with each other: 1) love with family: TIME spent together baking, playing games, watching Christmas movies..., and 2) ways to share love with others: go caroling to neighbors, send cards to nursing homes, cook a side dish for Hesed House... Then, choose one thing from one of the lists each day, to enjoy living and giving this LOVE of Jesus this Christmas season together as family.

Let us watch, wait, and prepare our hearts so that we are ready to participate in this year's new birth of Jesus' love for each one of us, and all of us in this world.

What's in a name? A lot! His parents named him Jesus. Prophets, shepherds, wise men and angels addressed him by other names. This Advent and Christmas, our sermon series is based on Adam Hamilton's book *Incarnation*, helping us explore the meanings of Jesus's titles and what they tell us about the babe of Bethlehem we celebrate in worship. Join us for Coffee-Time Zoom every Sunday in December from 10-10:30 a.m. - a time just to chat and catch up! The Zoom link will be sent via email to the congregation.

Sunday, December 6 – 2nd Sunday of Advent/Holy Communion. <u>Matthew 1:20b-21; Luke 2:8-12</u>

The Deliverer's Title: Savior. Who and what needs saving today? Saving from what and for what? Today we explore God's comprehensive salvation offered us in Jesus our Savior. Pastor Rich preaches.

Sunday, December 13 – 3rd Sunday of Advent. <u>Matthew 1:20b-23; Hebrews 1:1-3</u>

The Incarnate Title: Emmanuel. What does the pandemic have to do with Advent and Christmas? Everything! Fear is rampant. So why not fear? Because the heart of the Christmas story is that the God who has always been with God's people is with us now, in the flesh, in Jesus. Pastor Lisa preaches.

Sunday, December 20 - 4th Sunday of Advent. John 1:1-5; Matthew 5:14-16

Title: The Light of the World. We cannot appreciate the light that Christ brings until we linger in the dark for a while: pandemics, economic hardship, hurt and pain, grief and death. Then light shines in the darkness; the Word becomes flesh, and Jesus lights our way. Pastor Rich preaches.

Thursday, December 24 – Christmas Eve (posted online from 5 p.m. on)

Reverse Tenebrae Service. With the lighting of candles, we move from darkness to light, symbolizing the light of Christ breaking into our lives and our world in the birth of Jesus, our Savior. Special music includes children presenting a bells tune, a duet by Mike and Julie Popplewell, musical families singing beloved carols, and the virtual choir singing "Quietly" and "Silent Night."

Friday, December 25 – Christmas Day/Holy Communion (posted online from 6 a.m. on)

Worship will feature beloved carols, children playing bells, traditional scripture, and the celebration of Holy Communion. Pastor Becky will read a wonderful story about how every person, every creature, is a part of a far greater plan as God sent his Son on that first Christmas. Have your juice and bread or communion packet on hand.

Sunday, December 27 – 1st Sunday after Christmas. <u>Matthew 2:1-2, 8a, 9-11</u>

Title: Jesus is Lord. When the magi finally found baby Jesus, they knelt down and paid him homage. The first Christians were also clear that Jesus was the Lord, not Caesar. Jesus as Lord means that Jesus is the highest authority in our lives. Pastor Lisa preaches.

Disciple I Bible Study - coming in January!

Sisters and brothers in Christ, remember the song that Scott and the choir introduced to us a few year ago, "Order my steps in your word, O Lord. Lead me, guide me, every day. Send your anointing father I pray"? Here is your chance to make that song part of <u>your</u> action plan.

In January, we will be offering a **Disciple I Bible study** in 1-hour weekly Zoom gatherings, (holidays and most of the summer off) over a 2-year period. Health Team Update #6

The UMCG Health Team, including pastors, continues to meet to address issues and plan for the future as we move forward during the pandemic. The Trustees and Worship Teams are heavily involved in this effort. Their task is affected by the return to higher levels of COVID in our area. In addition, the air exchange requirements for any indoor gathering adds further complication.

A Town Hall Meeting was held for the congregation on Saturday, November 21. The Health Team along with the Worship Team and Pastors presented information on all the work they've been doing and criteria for reopening the church building. **The Town Hall Meeting will be available on our website** for viewing under the *Reach In* menu.

UMCG Church Conference held November 3

The UMCG 2020 Church Conference was held Tuesday, November 3 at 7 p.m. via Zoom. District Superintendent Rev. Jeffry Bross led the meeting and 32 attended. He shared a video message from Bishop Sally Dyck. Rev. Bross spoke about the 3 Conference goals and Pastor Rich addressed the question about how UMCG impacts the community.

In church business, salaries were approved for Pastor Rich and Pastor Lisa. The nominations list and Pastor Becky's salary were not ready for voting, so another church conference will be held in December.

Rev. Bross reported that statistics show that many UMC churches are doing well during the pandemic - attendance is up, expenses down, and giving is about the same or increased. He noted the toll on clergy who have shifted to doing everything online.

He also mentioned that a vote would be taken at Annual Conference on redistricting, going from 6 to 5 districts. Rev. Darneather Murph-Heath (Elgin District) is retiring in July, all other D.S.'s remain. Bishop Dyck will be retiring the end of December, and we will have Bishop John Hopkins as interim Bishop for most of 2021.

Angel Tree

If you would like to support the Angel Tree, there are three options this year:

1.) You can use the Walmart "Registry for Good." This is the easiest option as it allows you to shop from home and the gifts will be sent directly to The Salvation Army in St. Charles.

Instructions for accessing are below.

- Step 1: Go to https://www.walmart.com/registry/registryforgood/welcome
- Step 2: Scroll down to the "Find a cause in your community" map/search
- Step 3: Change the "location" to the St, Charles zip code of 60174
- **Step 4:** Click the Salvation Army St. Charles (Tri-City) Community Center Angel Tree. The registry list will open, displaying requested gift cards, toys and clothes.
- **Step 5:** SHOP! Add items to your cart and pay as you would for any online order. Walmart will ship the gifts directly to The Salvation Army in St. Charles.
- 2.) You can choose Angel Tree tags from the Salvation Army's virtual angel tree site. You will need to create an account to access the tags. <u>https://satricity.theangelgivingtree.org/</u>
