Retirements 🙆 New Appointment

The Staff Parish Relations Committee has announced two retirements and the appointment of our new Senior Pastor:

**Senior Pastor Rich Darr** will retire effective July 1, 2021. A video message from Pastor Rich and also one from Aurora District Superintendent Rev. Jeffry Bross were included in our online worship service on January 10. Read more in Pastor Rich's Note on page 2. Our congregation will celebrate Pastor Rich's ministry at UMCG and say farewell to Pastor Rich and Donna in June.

**Director of Communications Becky Nicol** will retire effective March 1, 2021. She is an ordained Elder in the NIC appointed part-time to UMCG. Pastor Becky will continue to work 10 hours a week on our online worship and website updates. Pastor Becky heard her call as a member of UMCG and also served at Manhattan (interim), and Burlington. She looks forward to continuing to preach and teach in the district.

However, after a vigorous debate, Church Council adopted Finance Committee's recommendation to fund just 60% of our 2020 Apportionments obligation. We felt this approach was prudent given the overall financial position of the Church at year-end.

## **UMCG Health Team Update**

**The UMCG Health Team** met for the first time in 2021 on January 11 and reviewed the current state of the pandemic in Kane County: the reopening criteria, as well as the NIC Absolute Guidelines Checklist. Currently, Kane County is experiencing an active outbreak of the Covid-19 virus and it's COVID risk level is red per the <u>CovidActNow</u> website. Given the current state of the pandemic it is unlikely that the church building will be reopened soon.

The Health Team will continue to meet on a regular basis and review the reopening criteria against the current conditions in Kane County and Illinois, as well as actively working the NIC Absolute Guidelines checklist to ensure that when the pandemic conditions warrant reopening that we will be ready. In the meantime, we hope that everyone will stay vigilant in taking the precautions necessary to be safe and well!

#### February 7 – 5th Sunday after the Epiphany Mark 1: 29-39

Jesus' ministry quickly sets a rhythm that balances prayer with service and teaching. How are we balancing our lives, making time for loving God and loving neighbor in all that we do? How do we fill up with God, and spill over in service to family and community? How do our lives demonstrate to others our commitment to love for God and love for neighbor? Pastor Lisa preaches, "Filling Up and Spilling Over."

#### February 14 – Worship with Bishop John Hopkins & the NIC Cabinet

The shepherds (in Luke) recognized Him. The Magi (in Matthew) recognized him. John the Baptist (in Mark) recognized Him. Can you recognize Jesus and commit your life to Him in this New Year? Our new Interim Bishop John Hopkins preaches, "Can You Recognize Jesus?"

#### February 17 – Ash Wednesday <u>Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21</u> Posted online at 7 p.m.

Ash Wednesday invites us to a forty-day Lenten journey that leads to Jesus's suffering and death but ultimately culminates in the triumph of Easter. In this season of preparation, what are the characteristics of religion and faith that God will reward? Pastor Rich preaches, "Receiving Your Reward."

#### February 21 – 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday in Lent <u>Psalm 25:1-10</u>

Where is God in all the troubles of this pandemic? Psalm 25 guides us to trust in the Lord, even in the midst of troubles and difficulties. The psalm is a model prayer calling us to learn - God will guide us and be with us through this. Pastor Becky preaches, "Trusting God in COVID Times."

#### February 28 – 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Lent <u>Mark 8:31-38</u>

Talk about paradox! Jesus's teaching today is perhaps the paradox of all paradoxes. What does he mean by saying that in attempting to save our lives we lose them? Let's explore Jesus's teaching that "losing means saving," a truth that will surely turn our lives and our world upside down. Pastor Rich preaches, "Losers Win!"



# **Rev. Rob Hamilton**

Pastor Rob Hamilton (he/him/his) grew up on a Kendall County farm where he was baptized and confirmed at Plattville United Methodist Church. It was at PUMC that Rob gave his first sermon, titled, "God Is Like A Chevy" as a teenager. It was Rob's emerging call to ministry that led him to North Central College in Naperville, IL to study religion. On Rob's first day college he met Meghan. After a few years of friendship, sharing a few ASP trips, finishing their undergraduate degrees, and dating they married in 2005.

After college, while Meghan completed a Master's Degree in Social Work, Rob was a staff youth pastor at Crossroads of Faith UMC, in Bolingbrook, IL. Rob soon received his MDiv from Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary in Evanston, IL where he made close friendships centered around Wesleyan Covenant Discipleship that they still practice together to this day. Rob received his first appointment in 2008 to Glenview UMC as Associate Pastor. In 2011, he was appointed to serve as Associate Pastor at The United Methodist Church of Geneva, IL where he served 4 years before being appointed as Senior Pastor of Rochelle UMC in 2015.

Rob whole-heartedly believes that God's grace is unconditional and available to all people even before we know it. For it is only by God's grace that lives are changed and the world is transformed through the sanctifying work of the Holy Spirit amongst the body of Christ. It ignites Rob's heart to share the journey of discipleship, build relationships with the surrounding community, and share the love of Jesus with acts of mercy, justice, compassion and outreach by loving God and neighbor as a community of faith and connectional church.

Rob and Meghan have two children, Lily and Ella. Spending time with his family renews Rob and he looks forward to summer camping trips and visiting national parks together. During his time in Geneva, Rob experienced adult on-set athleticism and picked up running as a hobby. Rob continues his early morning runs around town both for exercise and as an act of prayer.



## Reading the Gospels During Lent 2021 *The Reading Plan - by Jim Byrne*

Once again UMCG is encouraging everyone to read the Gospels during Lent. Moreover, everyone is encouraged to respond to the challenge Jesus gave the Apostles: "Go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation" (Mark 16:15). Invite

your relatives and friends to join in this important act of spiritual renewal and growth. Use e-mail, social media, the telephone, and even postal mail to send them copies of the reading program or to direct them to the UMCG Website where the program is posted. Form a reading group or recruit a reading buddy with whom you can share the reading experience.

The following reading plan is offered as a guide to enriching your Lenten experience. Before you begin reading each day, **prepare** by clearing your mind of the distraction in your life so that you can focus totally on the Bible passage. **Read** silently or aloud with both mind and heart open to the message. When you finish, **reflect** on what you have read, on how it relates to other passages in the Bible, and on how it relates to your life. **Share** what you have read and your reactions with family, a "reading buddy," or a reading or study group with whom you enjoy fellowship face-to-face, by telephone, or by e-mail, Facebook or other social media. Most importantly, **pray** to God in thanksgiving and supplication, and **listen** in silence for God's voice.
